Roukiatou’s son had surgery in September and missed over a month of school as a result. To aid in his recovery, the doctor recommended that he spend time exercising in the pool. If he were able to go to a program at the pool after school, he would be able to strengthen his legs, but these programs either cost too much or have long waiting lists. An increase in funding for Out of School Time (OST) programs could be used to ensure that my son and children like him have access to recreational and therapeutic programming without having to miss school hours. Will you commit to working with Mayor Bowser and the council to increase OST funding to \$25 million? But this sort of trauma is hardly unique; studies show that living in poverty (essentially being in survival mode when it comes to housing and food) hinders children's development and is traumatic—for many Ward 5 families, this state of survival is a reality. My experience has taught me that kids need more preventative measures for coping with the effects of trauma and that parents need to be part of ending the stigma around mental health.
